From the Solid Waste & Recycling Committee:

Please note a few details or save this Arrow for future reference.

- We have replenished yellow recycling decals for your roadside recycle bins. Please pick yours up from the shelf in the town shed today! Using the decals makes it much easier for drivers to identify your recyclable items as such. Unmarked bins containing recyclables could accidentally be viewed as trash. Please make sure your yellow decals are clearly visible, and separate your trash from recyclable containers by at least 4 feet to help out our hard-working haulers.
- Please consider signing up for the town "Google group." It is one way that we send out news from our committee, and signing up is easy. Just visit http://groups.google. com/group/arrowsic and click on "apply for membership."
- Dispose of unwanted prescription or overthe-counter pills at the Bath Police **Department**. There is a green Medicine Return chute right inside the station, always available. Put in prescriptions, OTC meds, vitamins, pet meds, samples, etc in pill form. No ointments, lotions, aerosols, thermometers, hydrogen peroxide, inhalers, needles, business/clinic materials, or bloody wastes, please.
- Take syringes to your doctor or to the lab department of a hospital. Do not throw syringes in the trash!!!
- Compact Fluorescent bulbs and fluorescent tubes contain mercury. Carefully take spent ones - for free- to any retailer that sells them and find a clerk. Or take them, fee charged, to Pine Tree or Bath landfill. (Broken ones must go to Pine Tree or Bath Landfill in a container or labeled bag.)
- Please bear in mind that appropriate curbside disposal practices are in the hands of our residents. There is little to no chance to intercept improperly disposed or recycled items, once they are placed curbside. Continued in next column...

ALEWIVES are running, alewives are running!

Monitors set the monitoring trap early April during a low flow period due to the lack of spring run off. We could see fish arriving at the downstream side of the culvert and stopping due to lack of water in the culvert. April 20th, rain five inches and the alewives are running. While still down from historic highest, this season will easily be the largest run since we began monitoring in 2007. Reports from other runs are similar this season and every season is different.

Since making the 2008 in-stream



improvements, the Conservation Commission has been working toward replacing the culvert with an enhanced fish passage control structure. To that end, the Conservation Commission partnered with Kennebec Estuary Land Trust and applied for funding to plan for and design the structure. We received funding through a Maine Coastal Program Grant administered by the State Planning Office now Land Use under the Department of Conservation. This money will be used to map the pond bottom near the culvert, summarizes the monitoring results to date and document the history of the culvert and fishery.

If you know anything about the culvert or the historical use of the culvert by fish *please* let us know. "Anything" might be as simple as a childhood (or adulthood) memory or a vague recollection of went it was first replaced or later maintained. One of the most helpful memories we have heard is, a resident recalling what his father was saying when he was a young kid.
