CPR CLASSES OFFERED

Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) is once again being offered to the citizens of Arrowsic on May 9, 9-12 a.m., at the Town Hall. The \$15 cost includes student handbook.

CED OFFERS WIC PROGRAM

Coastal Economic Development Corporation, a community action agency based in Bath, is reaching out to the estimated one-third of eligible women who are unaware of the WIC program. WIC is an acronym for the Special Supplemental Food and Nutrition Education Program for Women, Infants and Children. Currently the local WIC program helps about 1,400 women in the mid-coast area, but there are more who are eligible but may not be aware of the program. Any residents of Arrowsic can receive more information at the Town Hall during office hours.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT

All filling, grading and other earthmoving activities involving 25 yards or more and any such activity in the resource protection or shoreland districts require a Conditional Use Permit before starting.

The Planning Board has received two publications from the state. One is *Designing Communities to Protect Wildlife Habitat and Accommodate Development*, the other is *Integrating Wildlife Habitat into Local Planning: A Handbook for Maine Communities*. Both these publications describe the increasing sprawl around the state and its negative impact on wildlife. The board hopes a volunteer, perhaps a high school or college student, might wish to use these documents to help the town do some conceptual planning to help protect wildlife and ensure that Ar
