Until 20 years ago, first-class postage or hand delivery were the only effective ways to reach everyone with important Town news. But with the explosion of internet technologies, things are changing quickly. Some people still prefer to rely on the U.S. mail while others have embraced a paperless world. The cost of communicating by the U.S. mail has also increased substantially. It now costs the Town about \$200 each time it sends out a notice to each and every resident and taxpayer and, even so, we've had complaints that the postal service isn't delivering *The Arrow* to everyone.

As a result, the Select Board has decided to send out a form asking each resident about their preferred form of contact. If enough residents opt to receive Town notices via email, then we can still send first-class mail to those who prefer hardcopy while simultaneously reducing the overall costs of communication.

We'll be sending out a form later this fall once we've considered issues like confidentiality. Be sure to check your mailboxes and help out by promptly filling it out and returning it to us.



Zoning Board of Appeals has two vacancies!

The Zoning Board of Appeals has two vacancies at this time. The role of the ZBA is to hear and decide appeals from aggrieved parties regarding decisions of the Arrowsic Planning Board or Codes Enforcement Officer that they believe to be in error. Under certain circumstances, the ZBA may also authorize variances to the Zoning Ordinance. The PB and CEO decisions are conscientiously and thoroughly considered but, though infrequently utilized, the ZBA has an essential role in affording due process for Town property owners. Previous experience with rules, by-laws or ordinances is helpful.

Let’s Get Organized About Education

Since Arrowsic joined Regional School Unit 1 (RSU1) in 2008, a number of residents have continued to work on education issues in a variety of formal and ad hoc committees. At the beginning of the summer, the Select Board asked me to work with community members on formalizing these activities and how the Town addresses educational issues.

Several residents met in July and August to discuss what has happened over the last 10 years, how RSU1 functions, and what the Arrowsic School Committee used to do. People who attended one or more meetings on this topic include Dena and Matt Bachman, Nancy Brown Stump, Lisa Holley, David Howe, Camille Kauffunger, Janet Kehl and Karen Robbins. Our next step is to identify the specific functions that the Town wants to have carried out and to look at options for formally addressing those needs, whether through a standing education committee, an advisory group, or some other arrangement. The education functions we have already considered range from monitoring the RSU’s performance to broader questions of education policy, reviewing curricula, and organizing activities for Arrowsic students.

Whether you are the parent of a school-age child or not, we all have a responsibility to assure that our Town and school district provide good educational opportunities. In many ways, there isn’t anything more important for our future.



