Summer has gone and the leaves will soon be falling. What to do with all those leaves that you have to rake up? Don't put them out with your trash- there are better alternatives

• *Mulch*

Leaves make great mulch. It's free and as good—if not better—than anything you can buy. With a little effort, converting leaves to mulch using a shredder, weed whacker, or even a lawn mower is an economical and effective way to produce nutrient-rich mulch for lawns, landscapes or garden plots as the cooler months descend.

• *Compost*

Adding leaves along with grass, sticks, pine straw and a little soil to your compost pile will result in high quality compost rich in nitrogen that is ideal for use in your vegetable garden or for shrub and tree plantings
