- 5. Karen and Paul will finalize the well-head survey and prepare it for distribution with the annual report.
- 6. The 2017 alewife permit has been applied for and we are awaiting its arrival and ice out.
- 7. Clarke has connected with Paul Kaulkstein and is working on the website.
- 8. Brown-tail moth updates: This afternoon the Commission was asked to write a letter of support for a study of BTM spray programs to be submitted tomorrow. The Commission did not feel it has enough time to write and submit the letter. Because of the cost, the Commission decided to not pursue the idea of setting up a resident rebate fund for households in town that spend money on mechanical abatement.
- 9. The commission continued the discussion of possible new members and will continue to think about and talk to people before making recommendations to the Select Board.
- 10. Nature's Notes: Clarke saw a healthy mink. Eagles have been fighting and also seen fishing at the culvert. Noreen has a very plump skunk.
- 11. Mail: The annual Association of Maine Conservation Commissions solicitation arrived with a hand written note asking the Commission to write a case study of the culvert project for their web site. Karen will follow up.
